Our expert staff will help you and your family navigate the medical system, weigh options, and communicate with your physician(s) while helping with symptom management and clinical needs.

What services should we expect?

- Supportive care services provided wherever you call home
- VNA's board-certified physician and her team make home visits and prescribe medications to ease your symptoms
- RN care coordination working with you and your family to develop a care plan, including advanced directives
- Assistance with communication between you and care provider(s) regarding treatment options
- 24/7 nurse access

Who is part of the care team?

You will have access to a dedicated care team to manage symptoms along with spiritual, social and emotional support.

- Board-Certified Palliative Physician and Nurse Practitioner
- Palliative Care Nurse
- Medical Social Worker
- Chaplain
- Volunteer(s)

Who is eligible?

You may be eligible for the VNA Care Choices program if you have a diagnosis of end-stage CHF, COPD, HIV/AIDS, cancer, liver disease, or other pulmonary disease.

Who pays for this service?

VNA Care Choices is often covered by Medicare and private insurance and our expert staff will check with your provider before you are enrolled in the program. For specific questions regarding coverage, please contact us.

How do we get started?

- 1. Patients may be referred by their physician or families reach out to us directly. If a physician refers you to our care, we will work directly with the doctor to review all medical records. If you reach out to us, we will connect with the physician to begin the referral and medical review process.
- 2. A VNA Care Choices Community Liaison will reach out to you to conduct a benefits review and complete any necessary paperwork. Once the paperwork is complete, a nurse will visit the patient for a full evaluation which will inform the plan of care.
- 3. If the patient meets eligibility criteria, he/she is admitted to the program and a customized care plan is put into action and home visits will begin.
